This mission was my first time in Honduras! Staying at the Baxter Institute was a great experience, and I loved being a part of the students' lives who lived there. The people there took very good care of our group, and it was a beautiful place to be.

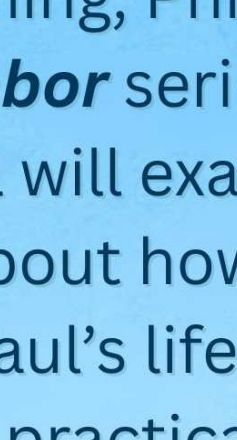
I cannot say enough good things about the Breaking Chains team. They are so hardworking in all that they do and compassionate to every person around them. The impact they are having on the community in Tegucigalpa cannot be measured. They led our group in building and painting houses for four different families in the area, as well as taking us on two street feeds. The street feed was my favorite thing we did for a couple of reasons, one being that it got me out of my comfort zone the most. It feels pretty exposing to be in a Tegucigalpa alleyway and having zero control over who walks up to you, but I think that the vulnerability I felt in this moment helped me to see more clearly that God is always working to accomplish his mission.

We also got the opportunity to help out at two different schools in the area. I am always amazed by the way God's love can overcome any language barrier, and the way our group connected with the kids at the schools and in the village was no exception. It was so much fun laughing and playing with them. I know our time with the kids had just as much impact on us as it did on them, if not more.

This experience reminded me of how big and loving our God is! I left Honduras with a full heart, grateful for the people we met, the memories we made, and the ways we saw God move. I'll carry this trip with me for a long time!

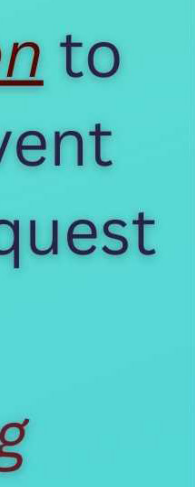
Podcast

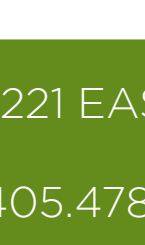
